


Our History, and Why.

WakeUp Carolina is a community-based movement born out of one family's heartbreaking loss of their son, Creighton, in the summer of 2016. Creighton's family made a promise and a commitment to share their story and affect change. The community rose to the need and partnered to ensure "that no one and no family walks this walk alone."

Nanci Shipman's openness ignited a cause and shed a bright light on the larger crisis of Opioid misuse locally and nationally. In honor of Creighton and in keeping with the promise made to provide hope in recovery, Creighton's House was born. Creighton's siblings, Wheaton, Jack and Hollice, sparked the idea for a safe place to be a bedrock for those in recovery. A place that would meet young adults, youth and their families "where they are" on their journey. A place with peer support specialists, tools and resources, and other young like-minded people on the path to recovery could be found. WakeUp Carolina is proud to bring their vision to fruition.

Today Nanci Shipman, WakeUp Carolina's founder, is joined by a groundswell of support from others impacted by substance misuse to create and sustain WakeUp Carolina's Creighton's House.

PEER SUPPORT

Training to be credentialed as a Peer Support Specialist and services provided by Peer Support Specialists are provided by WakeUp Carolina.

A peer support worker is someone with the lived experience of recovery from a mental health condition, substance use disorder, or both. They provide support to others experiencing similar challenges. They provide non-clinical, strengths-based support and are "experientially credentialed" by their own recovery journey (Davidson, et al., 1999). Peer support workers may be referred to by different names depending upon the setting in which they practice. Common titles include peer specialists, peer recovery coaches, peer advocates, and peer recovery support specialists.

HARM REDUCTION

WakeUp Carolina offers harm reduction training and materials to the community. Narcan and Fentanyl testing kits are available.

RAPID HIV TESTING

We offer Rapid HIV testing.

NARCAN TRAINING

We partner with the community to provide Narcan training. We are a one of two charitable organizations providing free Narcan in the area.
